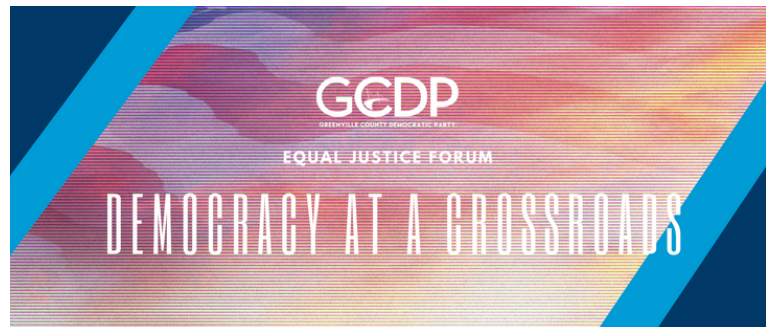

# ASK KATE!

*Former County Chair Kate Franch is our go-to resource for information about all things election-related. She is also the GCDP liaison to the county Election Office. So listen up as she addresses some of the issues/questions we've been seeing so far.*

## **Q. What if I've moved within the county or changed my name and haven't updated voter registration?**

A. There are a couple of options but your best bet is to go to County Square **on** Election Day where you can update your registration and cast your ballot at the same time.



## **Q. Who can witness my absentee ballot?**

A. Anyone with an address. Your spouse, neighbor, or Amazon delivery person are all OK. The problem is always in the details, so make sure your witness writes their address in full under the signature line. Don't forget to seal your ballot in the inner security envelope and sign the voter's oath on the outside envelope. You do not need to add any postage to the envelope. It's paid for by the state.



## **Still need an absentee ballot?**

The deadline to apply is Saturday, Oct. 24, at 5 p.m. You can request a ballot in person at County Square, online at [scvotes.gov](https://scvotes.gov), or by calling the Election Office at 864.467.7250.

Your ballot will be mailed to you, but the recommendation is that you get your voted ballot in the mail by Oct. 27 – the week before Election Day.

If the turnaround seems too tight, drop your ballot off at County Square by 7 p.m. Nov. 3.

## **Q. Why are the lines so long?**

A. A combination of a lot of energized voters eager to cast their ballot and an increase in the time it takes to check in voters. It is taking poll workers three to four times longer for this qualification process, due to slower

computer processing times. Being prepared for delays will help, so bring a chair, umbrella (portable shade), water, and your **valid, unexpired photo ID**. You can go to any of the locations. So far Mt. Pleasant has had the shortest lines.

## **Q. I'm returning my ballot and my husband's to County Square. What do I need?**

A. You can return a ballot for anyone but you must have their written permission. That's the yellow sheet that comes with your absentee ballot. It must be fully completed and signed by both the voter whose ballot you are returning and you.

You'll also need your **valid and unexpired voter ID**. You do not need the ID of the voter whose ballot you are returning. Just yours. And since most of us carry our driver's license and other identification, that shouldn't be a problem. Right?

## **Q. I have an absentee ballot but I've decided to vote in person. What do I do with the ballot I was mailed?**

A. A lot of people are asking this question. Take your absentee ballot to County Square, directly to the Election Office, Suite 1900. They will give you an authorization to vote. You can then present that when you go to vote either in person at County Square or one of the four satellite locations, or on Election Day at

your precinct polling place. (See Pages 8-10).

**If you have voted your absentee ballot and want to return it in person** you can drop it off at any of the 5 locations without waiting in line. At all locations, you will hand your ballot to a poll worker, who will check your photo ID and timestamp it as received.

# Voting on Election Day?

## You'll see some changes and more long lines

If you are voting on Election Day, the qualifying (check-in) process will look a bit different, and that's not just because of the COVID-19 health protocols being followed at the polling sites.

Poll workers will be using new "E-Poll Book" stations (not the familiar laptop) to confirm your voter registration status, determine your ballot style (reflects the candidates running in your particular set of political districts from congressional to school board seats), and mark you as a voter. Greenville County has 347 ballot styles this election!

You will no longer sign a paper poll list that contains the voter's oath; instead, you will use a stylus to sign directly on the "E-Poll Book" touchscreen. Poll workers will sanitize the stylus after each voter.

In addition, the number of your ballot style will be printed on the ballot card that will be handed to you at the completion of qualification. That number will be read by the ballot-marking device (BMD) when you insert it to begin voting and pull up what should be your correct ballot.

If you do not see a candidate you were expecting to see on your ballot, ask for assistance from the poll workers. You are allowed to take a voting guide into the voting "booth" – it can be anything from a handwritten list of your candidate choices to a printed guide provided to you.

If you choose to vote using the straight-ticket option at the beginning of the voting process, then all candidates of the political party you chose will be automatically selected for you in the following races/districts.

As you scroll through the pages, those candidates should have a check mark next to their name. You may unselect one if you prefer to not vote for them or to split your vote and select a candidate of a different party. Nonpartisan candidates, such as those running for school board, will be listed on the last couple of pages.

**Be sure to review your selections on the ballot marking device screen before you hit "print," then review the printed ballot before you go to the scanner. If at any point you have a question about what you see on the BMD screen or your ballot card, then ask for assistance. Once you insert your ballot into the scanner, your vote is recorded and no changes can be made.**

# Make A Plan To Vote

Many of us have already voted. We still have nearly two more weeks of early voting before Election Day. No matter how you plan to vote, make a plan to vote. Know where you're going, what you need and who's going with you. That last part is important. Take a friend (or two or three) to keep you company in line and to make sure #EveryoneVotes. ## When and where?

Every day is Election Day this year since all voters are now permitted to vote early in person using the "State of Emergency" excuse. There are five locations.

County Square on M-F from 8:30 to 5 p.m. and at four satellite locations on M-F from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.. County Square also has extended hours on Oct. 22 until 7 p.m., and on Saturday Oct. 24 and 31 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

## What you need to take

You **must** bring a authorized form of voter ID: Current SC Driver's License, DMV ID card, SC Voter Registration Card with a photo, Federal military ID, or current US Passport.

Long lines are expected to continue, so you'll want to bring a stadium chair, some water, possibly an umbrella or hat for shade. And wear comfortable shoes!

## What you need to know

It is your right to vote. If you are properly credentialed and at the correct location, you may vote. If you have a question, if you are challenged, if you feel your right to vote is being suppressed, call the South Carolina Voter Protection Hotline at

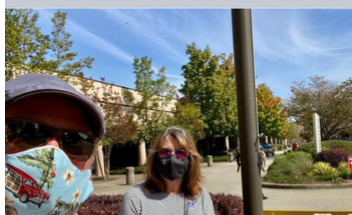
